About the EUSECU-POLE Project

The Jean Monnet Project “EU Approaches to Transnational Security Challenges: Focus on Policy Learning” (EUSECU-POLE) supported by the European Commission aims to enhance knowledge, promote discussion and policy learning of EU legal and policy responses to various transnational security challenges among various Russian audiences (academics, students, policy-makers, civil servants, legal practitioners, civil society). The Project is implemented by Lobachevsky University of Nizhny Novgorod (Russia) in partnership with University of Strasbourg (France).

Overview of the Executive Training

The Executive Training is one of the two core EUSECU-POLE Project events. The rationale behind the Training is its “learning from experts” approach. Its main aim is to form advanced knowledge on the Project’s topic, as well as on methods of teaching EU law and policy for a group of Russian university teachers. The Executive Training focuses on EU approaches to transnational security challenges. Speakers address the origins, evolution and substance of policies within the European Area of Freedom, Security and Justice, as well as its external dimension, focusing on institutional aspects and such issues as counter-terrorism policies, migration governance, approaches to human rights and security issues, policies against organized crime, use of technology and data protection. Apart from specialized lectures, the Training includes an expert roundtable and study visits to European institutions in Strasbourg.

■ Speakers' Biographies

Prof Marie-Laure Basilien-Gainche

University of Jean Moulin Lyon 3

Professor in public law at the University Jean Moulin Lyon 3 and member of the Institut Universitaire de France, Marie-Laure Basilien-Gainche is member of the Centre de Droit Constitutionnel (CDC) of this University and of the Centre de Recherche et d'Etudes sur les Droits Fondamentaux (CREDOF) of the University Paris Nanterre. She is also associate fellow of the Global Migration Center of the Graduate Institute (Geneva), of the Border Criminologies group of the School of Law of Oxford University and of the Center of Migration Law at Radboud University (Nijmegen). Her areas of expertise are European Law, Migration Law, Constitutional Law, and Human Rights Law. The researches she carries out are focused on the analysis of the exceptions: the situations of serious crises which allow the concentration of powers and the restriction of rights, and the areas of legal confinement which can conduce to power abuses and rights infringements. She is involved in different academics association, such as the immigration network of the Council for European Studies of Columbia University, the European University Network on the Area of Freedom, of Security and Justice (GDR ELSJ), the Migration Law network and the Refugee Law Initiative. Prof Florence Benoît-Rohmer

University of Strasbourg

Florence Benoît-Rohmer holds a PhD in Public Law. She was President of the Université Robert Schuman (URS), Strasbourg, from 2003 to 2008. She has served as the French national director of the European Master's Degree in Human Rights and Democratisation (E.MA) since its inception in 1997 and is currently Director of the MA programme in Human Rights at the University of Strasbourg. She has extensive experience in teaching Human Rights Law and Fundamental Rights in the EU. She has also been teaching EU Law at different Universities in the EU, as well as in China and Russia. Florence has supervised 20 PhD theses. Prof. Benoît-Rohmer's research interests range from the study of the European Charter of Fundamental Rights, the European Convention on Human Rights, and Constitutional Rights in Central and Eastern European countries, to national minority rights. She has been acting as human rights expert for the Council of Europe and the EU, was member of the European Network of Independent Experts on Fundamental Rights set up by the European Commission, and president of the Scientific Committee of the Fundamental Rights Agency of the EU. She is also member of the academic advisory boards of several international journals specialized in human rights, and in particular minority rights.

Prof Emanuel Castellarin

University of Strasbourg

Emanuel Castellarin is Professor of Public Law at the University of Strasbourg (France), Assistant Professor at the American Graduate School in Paris and invited Senior Lecturer at the Sorbonne Law School, University of Paris I Panthéon-Sorbonne. He is currently the Director of the Research Federation “Europe en mutation” at the University of Strasbourg (jointly with the French National Centre for Scientific Research (CNRS)). He is member of the French Society for International Law (French branch of the International Law Association). He holds a PhD in Law from the University Paris I Panthéon-Sorbonne (2014). He has received his MA in International Economic Law from the University Paris I Panthéon-Sorbonne (2010), a Diploma from the Academy of International Law in The Hague (2012), BA and MA in Law from the University of Pisa (2011), Diploma of the *Ecole Normale Supérieure*, Paris (2011), Diploma of the Sant' Anna School of Advanced Studies, Pisa (2008). His research focuses on the European Union’s participation in international economic institutions, use of international law within internal jurisdictions.

Dr Carolina Cerda Guzman

University of Paul-Valéry Montpellier III

Carolina Cerda-Guzman is an Associate Professor of Constitutional Law at the University Paul-Valéry Montpellier 3. She obtained her PhD in Public Law from the University of Bordeaux in 2010. Since 2006, she has developed her research on the legal responses to fight terrorism. The goal of this research is to study the legal bases of counter-terrorism laws, the use of emergency powers and the judicial remedies existing to protect Human Rights from the abuses made by the States in order to fight against terrorism. Her research is mainly focused on European countries, and particularly France and Spain, and on the United States of America. Carolina was a guest on national French Radio “France culture” the week after the attacks of November 2015 in Paris in order to speak about the project of constitutional reform of deprivation of citizenship and constitutionalisation of the emergency state in France. Carolina is also member of the IACL (International Association of Constitutional Law) Research Group “*Constitutional Responses to Terrorism*” created in 2006. She is actually member of a workshop of the “Société de Législation Comparée” on compared counter-terrorism policies. She has done lectures on this topic in several European universities, such as the Universidad Autonoma de Barcelona, the Università Ca Foscari of Venice or the Université Paris I – La Sorbonne.

Dr Daniela Irrera

University of Catania

Daniela Irrera (PhD in International Relations, University of Catania) is Associate Professor of Political Science and IR at the University of Catania, where she teaches International Politics and Global civil society and serves as IR Deputy at the Department of Political and Social Sciences. She is currently President of the European Peace Research Association (EuPRA). She has been Visiting Fellow in several Universities in Europe, US, Asia and Canada. She has been awarded with a DAAD Fellowship at the Peace Research Institute Frankfurt and with a research grant at the European Union Center of Excellence, University of Alberta, Canada. She has taught at IBEI, Barcelona within the MUNDUSMAPP Erasmus Mundus program. She has extensively published in the areas of International Relations and EU politics, dealing with global terrorism, transnational organized crime, civil society and humanitarian affairs.

Prof Julien Jeandesboz

Free University of Strasbourg / Université libre de Bruxelles (ULB)

Julien Jeandesboz is Professor at the Université libre de Bruxelles (ULB), where he is also a member of REPI and of the Institute for European Studies (IEE). His research interests include security and surveillance, border control, technology, and international political sociology. His recent publications include two co-edited special issues on 'Questioning security devices' in *Security Dialogue* (with Anthony Amicelle and Claudia Aradau), on 'Politics and "the digital"' in the *European Journal of Social Theory* (with Marcile Kaufmann) and chapter 'EU home affairs and technology: how to make sense of information and data' in *Routledge Handbook of Justice and Home Affairs Research* (2017).

Prof Christian Kaunert

Free University of Brussels / Vrije Universiteit Brussel (VUB), Belgium

Prof Dr Christian Kaunert is the Academic Director of the Institute for European Studies at the Vrije Universiteit Brussel and Full Professor of European Politics. He was previously Full Professor of International Politics, as well as Director of the European Institute for Security and Justice at the University of Dundee. Prior to that, he researched and taught at various international universities (Barcelona, Paris, Florence, Moscow, Cairo, etc.). Prof. Dr Kaunert was awarded a Jean Monnet Chair in *EU Justice and Home Affairs* (2013) and in *EU Counter-Terrorism* (2017) and a Marie Curie Career Integration Grant (2012-2016). He holds a PhD in International Politics and an MSc in European Politics from the University of Wales, Aberystwyth. His research has a clear focus on the Global Security role of the EU, especially in the area of EU Justice and Home Affairs, with a particular focus on terrorism and counter-terrorism. He is the author of numerous articles and frequently acts as speaker or panelist at international conferences on his areas of expertise.

Dr Oleg Korneev

University of Paris 13

Dr. Oleg Korneev is a Research Fellow at the CERAL, Faculty of Law, Political and Social Sciences, University of Paris 13 (France). He is the Principal Investigator of the project "Contested Global Governance, Transformed Global Governors? International Organisations and "Weak" States" (GLOBALCONTEST) funded by the French National Research Agency (ANR) for 2016-2019. Prior to this, he was Senior Marie Curie Fellow at the Department of Politics, University of Sheffield (UK, 2013-2015), Jean Monnet Fellow at the European University Institute (Italy, 2011-2013), City of Paris Postdoctoral Fellow at CERI/Sciences Po-Paris (France, 2010-2011). He has received his MA in Sociology and Social Anthropology from Central European University (Budapest, 2006), his BA/MA in International Relations (2005) and his PhD in History (2009) from Tomsk State University (Russia). His research addresses global migration governance, international organizations, production and transfer of expert knowledge, migration governance in Eastern Europe and Central Asia, EU-Russia cooperation on migration management. It appeared, in particular, in *Global Governance, Journal of Ethnic and Migration Studies, European Journal of Migration and Law, European Foreign Affairs Review*. One of his recent publications is "The Eastern Partnership countries and Russia: a migration-driven cooperation agenda with the European Union" (with Peter Van Elsuwege) in *Routledge Handbook of Justice and Home Affairs Research* (2017).
