You have submitted an application to the Erasmus+ programme, 2020 call for proposals of the action specified above. The call for proposals closed on 20/02/2020. The Education, Audiovisual and Culture Executive Agency (EACEA) received 1447 eligible applications for the Jean Monnet Activities.

I am writing to inform you about the selection decision taken by the Head of Department of the Agency, acting in her capacity as authorising officer, based on the recommendations of an Evaluation Committee assisted by external experts.

I am pleased to inform you that your application has been selected for EU co-funding.

It received 96/100 points, which is on or above the minimum threshold for funding given the available budget by actions:

For your information, out of the 1447 eligible applications 360 have been selected for funding.

	<p>The Module shall develop teaching and research on European Law and Politics by focusing on the study of the EU Area of Freedom, Security and Justice (AFSJ) and its various facets. The activities are presented in a very competent way. It would strengthen EU expertise already in place. It is clearly in line with the objectives of the JM programme.</p> <p>The project outline is clear and complete. New compulsory teaching courses are comprehensively presented, with detailed syllabi, reading lists, discussion of methods and learning outcomes. Related research, didactic materials and most articles would be issued in Russian and English. Conferences and lectures would involve European experts, but no practitioners. Phasing and methodology are well explained and in detail. Overall, the workplan is coherent and of excellent quality.</p> <p>The project team of Professors of Law and Political Science, from several Russian and one European University, is highly qualified for implementation of the Module. They are experienced in working on EU affairs, particularly on AFSJ and related aspects. All Russian team members have experience of study or work in European universities or institutions.</p> <p>Target groups would be the students, academics and practitioners who would develop competences in EU study. The dissemination is well described. It is envisaged to make the Module sustainable beyond its lifetime. Quality control and monitoring would be overseen by an Advisory Board including European experts. Peer-review of publications and feedback from students are foreseen.</p>
